And complain to head of housing for a meeting to discuss why they aren't issuing letters to the people doing this on a regular basis.

8. Edinburgh Airport - October/November 2025

Edinburgh airport flight path changes meeting set for Dunfermline - November 11th 2025

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- Dunfermline will host its first meeting about the Airspace Modernisation at the start of next week with concerns of the impact that changes to Edinburgh Airport's flight paths will have on West Fife villages.
- The Scottish Airspace Modernisation Consultation was launched to give communities, political representatives and other stakeholders the opportunity to share their views on the proposed changes.
- There have been concerns from residents that their villages may be impacted by loud noise, and they will have the opportunity to voice them next week.
- **Glasgow Airport** - announces new direct WestJet flights to Toronto for 2026 - November 18th
- **Edinburgh Airport** - All flights were suspended at [Edinburgh Airport](#) after an IT issue affecting its air traffic control services - December 5th 2025
Passengers have been caught in travel mayhem this morning after [Scotland](#)'s busiest airport halted all flights, with several full planes sitting on the tarmac.
The cause of the IT glitch is not known yet, but it is not linked to the [ongoing Cloudflare outage](#), Edinburgh Airport told **Metro**, adding that the issue is localised. Cloudflare, which provides services to major websites like [Spotify](#) and Etsy, went down this morning, blocking many major online retailers websites.
- **Edinburgh Airport** - could be first to offer fast track to America with 'preclearance' - December 11th 2025
Airport boss Gordon Dewar says if Scottish and US governments can agree, 'we'll start building the next day'
Better to America: that is the aim of the [Edinburgh airport](#) chief executive Gordon Dewar. Allowing transatlantic airline passengers to clear US arrival formalities while still in the UK "would be incredibly powerful" for the Scottish hub, he said.
Mr Dewar is seeking agreement for the Scottish capital to be the first airport in the UK offering "[preclearance](#)" of the American border process.
The system, already in place at airports in Ireland, Canada and elsewhere, involves [US Customs and Border Protection](#) officers assessing passengers before they board flights to America. Assuming the traveller passes the checks, they are effectively on US territory. The system requires governmental approval – which the Edinburgh airport boss believes could be made easier because of President Trump's "enthusiasm for Scotland."
Scotland's first minister, John Swinney, raised the subject when meeting Mr Trump on visit to Aberdeenshire in July 2025.
- **Edinburgh Airport** - Turkish Airlines opens new lounge at Edinburgh Airport elevating premium travel offering - 03/01/2026
Turkish Airlines – a Corporate Partner of the [FTE Digital, Innovation & Startuo Hub](#) – has opened its first-ever European lounge outside Istanbul at Edinburgh Airport. The new lounge further elevates Edinburgh's premium travel offering while reinforcing the airport's growing role as an international gateway.
Spanning 673sqm and accommodating 149 guests, the lounge offers a premium experience with facilities including an open buffet, a luxury relaxation area with TVs and Wi-Fi, and two prayer rooms. The lounge also includes an accessible restroom for passengers with reduced mobility, a baby care room, and flight information screens.
"The opening of our new Turkish Airlines Lounge at Edinburgh Airport marks an important milestone for our airline," said M. Akif Konar, Chief Operations Officer, Turkish Airlines.
"As our first abroad lounge in Europe and our eighth outside of Türkiye, this investment demonstrates our deep commitment to our European operations, where we already

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possess a strong presence. Looking ahead, we will continue to build on our presence in the region and bringing our award-winning hospitality closer to travellers here.”

- **Edinburgh Airport** - All you need to know about new Edinburgh Airport flightpaths over Fife - 15th January 2026

Big changes are planned for Scotland's skies — and they could have a direct impact on communities in West Fife, including Dunfermline, Dalgety Bay and Aberdour.

Edinburgh Airport is consulting on proposals to redesign its flight paths as part of a UK-wide programme to modernise airspace. The aim is to make air travel quicker, quieter and cleaner, while reducing delays and cutting carbon emissions. But while the overall goal is positive, the changes could mean some communities experience more aircraft noise than they do today.

The consultation runs until Sunday, January 25, 2026, and local residents are being urged to have their say.

- **General**
- A few ad hoc litter picks took place in December and January to help the D of E students get their volunteer hours completed, 23 bags of litter collected. Monthly litter pick took place on Sunday 25th January. The students will also assist in putting new wooden edging around the flower beds in Manse Road Gardens on Saturday.
- We had a meeting with two people who showed interest in the Secretary's post.
- One of our existing Volunteers has shown interest in taking over the Social Media position on the committee.

14. Spotlight Feature – Kirkliston Community Centre

- The Centre is run by a charity called the Kirkliston Community Centre Association SCIO. The building is Council owned and we have Business Support and Janitorial staff provided by them.
- There are currently 6 committee members who are also the charity's trustees and give their time voluntarily. There is a wide range of experience on the Management Committee, and we are all committed to making the centre a success.
- There are currently 25 weekly activities at the centre, and it is used by around 350 to 400 people each week. There are activities for young and old and everyone in between. The centre offers an opportunity for private tutors to run physical education activities, such as yoga and pilates. We host Brownies and Guides, provide space for local childminders to meet and activities for the children in their care. Orchard Nursery uses the centre to run breakfast and afterschool clubs Monday to Friday. And there is much more.....
- The lunch club for the older members of our community, run by Queensferry Care on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month, is really popular.
- The centre is not open on Saturdays but can be by request and a church uses the building on Sundays for their services.
- There are two very successful youth clubs operating on Mondays and Wednesdays and the Management Committee fund their expenses. Other things the Committee directly funds are:
 - Two art tutors - running art classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays
 - Samba Drum tutor - the samba band meets on Thursdays
- The Friday craft group
- Being an old building, it has some issues which we are constantly managing. Some parts of the roof and some windows are in urgent need of repair and replacement. While the Management Committee has funded some repairs, we cannot cover everything so we're in constant conversation with the Council about ongoing repairs. We do have a commitment from the Council that some of the repairs will start soon.
- Also, since we knew that the former nursery building was being vacated, we have been lobbying the Council for a concession which would allow us to use some of that space. We have an agreement in principle to use two of the rooms that are easily accessible from the Community Centre.
- If you've been to the Centre recently, you may have noticed that the old nursery garden and play area has been cleared. The two rooms we're planning to use have also been cleared but there are repairs to be made before we can do that. Watch this space. We strongly believe that it's important to retain the entire building for community use.

15. Current Matters

- **Presentation & Q&A /Liz McIntosh – QCCC**

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Liz McIntosh joined us from QCCC to share with the KCCC the work that they do. They have been established for 33 years and had a presence in 26 years in Kirkliston. They provide registered day care for over 65-year-olds. This provides personal care for individuals. The group also help people to be able to attend a lunch club. Clients normally attend a lunch club 1 day a week, but if needed due to their carer feeling particular stress, they can attend 2 lunch clubs a week. QCCC also have days for clients who may have cognitive issues (with or without diagnosis) on a Monday and Friday. The lunch club in Kirkliston runs on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month, and Ratho runs on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays. The co-ordinator for the lunch club is a salaried post but the rest of the team are volunteers.

A Supper Club runs on a Thursday night which is for clients who suffer dementia and their carer and gives a time with support where they can go out and spend quality time together and helps the carers feel less isolated.

Unfortunately QCCC lost funding from Edinburgh Integrated Joint Board and were awarded an interim resilience fund which allows the group some time to find alternative funding to keep them running.

Another service provided is the Befriending Service, which connects people and can help tackle loneliness and isolation. Also there are volunteers who can help with some gardening. The service is free but recipients can donate a small sum if they wish.

The day service can only be accessed with a referral from the council

- **Stirling Road Crossing Update**

The report has been shared to the CEC Councillors. The CEC have been contacted, and request has been sent to them to arrange a time to meet on the site. The report was also shared to the KPSA.

- **Living Rent Campaign open letter**

Request was received in Oct to put KCC name to an open letter about the council not tackling landlords appropriately. Brief discussion had that it may be this group are not recognised or thought highly of by councils. More time and further discussion to be had at our next meeting. **Action noted in action log.**

- **Kirkliston Place Plan**

QCC mentioned this when they attended a previous meeting. Raised was should we make a submission for Kirkliston. This is where we can submit what Kirkliston wish for as part of the Government Plan for our area.

We have until July to make a submission, and it can include items such as public transport/protecting the environment/flood risk.

- **Report From Fund Raising Sub Committee Report**

Next meeting planned for the early Feb.

- **Report From Communication Sub Committee Report**

Plan is to engage twice a month with the community and highlight positive results. All though this was a good idea.

16. AOCB

- **Public Right of Way padlocked gate on Foxhall Estate**

A Kirkliston resident wrote to J. Gammel raising their concern around the gate at the end of the ROW that was padlocked. The concerns raised is that there was no notification or public awareness of the closing of the existing footpath and altering the way it runs.

It has been advised that Conifox own the strip of land where the gate sits and has placed the gate in line with the trees on their property. This has been done over concerns for road safety, it is not safe for pedestrians to exit into the road.

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The reason the original path was altered is because there was a wall and the land needed to be raised. This was approved by the council and agreed in planning.
The issue is direct neighbours are very unhappy with the change to the ROW and now have no access to the path. **Action noted in action log.**
